Pronouns-Noun Substitutes				
Pronouns take the place of nouns. They can add variety to sentences by replacing a noun that has already been introduced to the reader.				
Example 1: <b>Lily</b> could hardly wait for her birthday to arrive. <b>Lily</b> wanted a new bike. <b>Lily</b> wanted to keep up with her older sister on bike rides.				
Example 2: <b>Lily</b> could hardly wait for her birthday to arrive. <b>She</b> wanted a new bike, so <b>she</b> could keep up with her older sister on bike rides.				
In Example 1 we meet <b>Lily</b> . The writer introduces <b>Lily</b> in the first sentence and repeats her name in the second and third sentences. Using the noun <b>Lily</b> three times makes the passage sound awkward.				
In Example 2 the noun <i>Lily</i> is introduced only <u>once</u> . The writer substituted the <u>pronoun</u> <i>she</i> for the <u>noun</u> <b>Lily</b> to improve the flow of the sentence.				
The word <i>Lily</i> is a noun. The word <i>she</i> is a pronoun.
