



2012-2013 TCAP Data Grades 3-4-5-6

Summit County School District in Colorado adopted Daily Language Instruction for use in Grades 1-6 as part of their approach to writing instruction beginning with the 2012-2013 school year.

The data below show the changes in writing scores on the Colorado State Assessment (TCAP) for students in grades 3-4-5-6 in the Summit district.

Depending on the school site, 14% to 66% of students receive free or reduced lunches. English Language Learners are 22% of the student population.

Desirable outcomes of 5% or greater between 3rd grade and 4th grade are highlighted in red.

Ex: In 2012 53.8% of Grade 3 students were proficient or advanced. The following year, as fourth graders, 60.3 were proficient or advanced.

Desirable outcomes of 5% or greater between 4th grade and 5th grade are highlighted in blue.

Ex: The percentage of students who were partially proficient dropped from 41.4% in 4th grade to 31.0% in 5th grade while those who were proficient increased from 44.6% to 55.2%.

Scores for students moving from 5th grade to 6th grade were static during this period of time.
