## Frequently Asked Questions - DLI Student Tasks Days 1-4

<p><b>Q. What is the purpose of the USB drive? Does this drive replace the DLI book?</b></p> <p>A. The USB drive does not replace the book. It is designed to be used in concert with your DLI print edition, and it includes <u>only</u> the items you would display for class discussion.</p> <p>(Day One-Day Four student tasks).</p> <p><b>Q. Why do I need the DLI book?</b></p> <p>1-The book provides all of the blackline masters for the <b>reproducible student materials</b>: Day One-Four student tasks + Day Five assessments, and spelling lists.</p> <p>2-The book also provides the teacher resource sections that are the engine for the DLI program. They include introductory materials to support implementation, mini-lessons to support introduction of each skill, and the KEY. (These sections are two-thirds of the book; they are not reproducible.)</p> <p><b>Terms of Use for the DLI book:</b></p> <p><u>Permitted</u>: With the purchase of one book, a teacher may reproduce student materials from the <u>DLI section</u> and <u>spelling lists</u> for his/her individual classroom, but not for any other classroom.</p> <p><u>Not Permitted</u>: No pages of the introductory section, mini-lesson section, and the KEY may be reproduced. No pages of the DLI BOOK may be scanned, posted to Google Classroom or similar platforms, school or teacher websites. (Documents on the <u>drive</u> may be posted to Google Classroom-see next column.)</p>	<p><b>Q. How many USB drives do we need to purchase for our team?</b></p> <p>A. Every teacher needs a USB drive. This is a <b>single use</b> media product and as such may be loaded on a single computer used by one person at a time.</p> <p><b>Q. What are the copyright terms for this USB drive?</b></p> <p>A. Copyright law for this kind of media <b>does NOT permit copies of any type, networking, or transmission</b>. In plain language, this includes digital copies of the documents on the USB drive, paper copies of the documents on the drive, uploading the documents to a teacher, school, or personal website, or transmission of the files via the Internet.</p> <p>*EXCEPTION: the Day One-Day Four tasks on the USB drive may be posted digitally for online access by your students in a platform such as Google Classroom, but <b>ONLY</b> if access is <b>fully secured</b>. This access <b>must be limited to the teacher's own</b> students and not be accessible to other teachers and/or students.</p> <p><b>Q. What forms of technology support the use of the documents on the drive?</b></p> <p>A. The PDF files on the drive work well with interactive whiteboards: SMARTboards, Promethean boards, and their competitors and LCD projectors.</p>						
<p><b>Q. May I print paper copies from the USB drive?</b></p> <p>A. The copyright does not permit paper copies from the USB drive.</p> <p><b>Q. Are these documents interactive?</b></p> <p>A. No. Unfortunately, the cost of developing interactive features would make the drive cost-prohibitive.</p>	<p><b>Q. I have an earlier edition of the book. Will the PDF documents on the drive correlate with it?</b></p> <p>A.
